












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

LIPOR - Serviço Intermunicipalizado de Gestão de Resíduos do Grande Porto (Intermunicipal Waste Management of Greater Porto) is a Municipalities Association focused on waste management and close cooperation with its associated Municipalities, for the past 37 years, always with due regard for the Mission determined by its Bodies.

It also adopts and complies with the guidelines on waste set by National and European Union Policies, fully obeying all binding Laws and Regulations, as any Organisation should.

Nowadays, any Organisation - whether public or private - that wishes to assert and consolidate a Sustainable Future must conceive, plan, communicate and permanently assess an Organisational Strategy, which is understandable to all Stakeholders and allows them to take part in its establishment and results.

In 2020, LIPOR is launching its first Integrated Report, following the latest trends in Sustainability reporting, in a broader value creation perspective.

The Board of Directors, the Management team and the Employees are aware of the difficult situation the Waste Sector is going through, not only in Portugal, but also worldwide, of the still complex transition from a Linear Economy to a Circular Economy, from a climate straining Economy to a Low Carbon Economy, the neglecting of fundamental Assets, such as Soils, Natural Capital and the protection of Ecosystems. Therefore, they have worked to define a vision that is essential to the future and the invigoration of the Organisation, which is based on LIPOR "changing from a waste management organisation into a producer of goods and services".

Only this way we will be able to stay in line with the guideline of focusing on a Circularity Strategy for our Business.

Meanwhile, it's clear to us that LIPOR's Ecosystem must strongly follow the current Integrated Waste Management System model, in order to create value, share that value with our Stakeholders and strengthen our Project based on the essential Policies for a Project for the Future and with a Future.

In this context, it is very important to mention:



- > The Investments we're making in Collection Systems managed and operated by the City Councils, which are important for the achievement of national Targets and Goals, particularly regarding biowaste and multimaterial recycling;
- > The Investments in newer, more modern Sorting and Organic Recovery Facilities, also increasing our capacity to recover the materials received;
- > The importance we've always placed, and now reinforce, on Prevention of waste production, the 1st pillar of proper waste management;
- > The importance given to Innovation and a Specialist Group, which develops and takes part in all future LIPOR Projects that embody the transition to a Circular Economy;
- > The continuous approach to a Low Carbon Economy, over more than a decade, with an important contribution from the "4M less Waste, less Carbon, more Climate, more Biodiversity" LIPOR Strategy, which is being developed in 2020;
- > The perfect alignment of our Policies, Projects and Initiatives with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs):
 - SDG 2: Zero Hunger Through the production of its natural soil improver NUTRIMAIS, LIPOR contributes to the preservation or enhancement of the natural fertility of soils.

- SDG 4: Quality Education The development of the Environmental Education and Intervention Programme (PEIA) aims to provide an educational offer that promotes citizen commitment to environmental practices and the acquisition of competencies for broader civic participation and environmentally responsible and sustainable behaviour.
- SDG 6: Clean Water and Sanitation The "Tinto River Valorisation Project" aims to monitor water quality, thus allowing for necessary interventions to recover this watercourse, restore the river's ecosystem and define its future sustainable use.
- SDG 7: Affordable and Clean Energy The Energy Recovery of unsorted waste favours the production of sustainable, local and partly renewable energy, just as the promotion of 2 Photovoltaic parks, with the production of electrical energy at the source.
- SDG 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth LIPOR ensures the compliance of the Quality, Environmental, Safety, Occupational Health and Social Accountability Management Systems, in order to pursue EXCELLENCE in its activities.
- SDG 9: Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure The implementation of a structured process for Innovation fosters internal knowledge and reinforces Research and Development synergies.
- SDG 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities The Adventure Park & Ecological Trail is a public leisure space that promotes physical activity and raises awareness, resulting from the sealing, rehabilitation and environmental landscape recovery of the former Landfill of Ermesinde/Baguim do Monte, which was restored to the population.
- SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production A set of policies, programmes and actions that promote the Prevention of Waste Production is continuously developed in order to boost change.

In 2020, LIPOR has decided to publish an Integrated Report, which reports its activities during the calendar year of 2019, from 1st January to 31st December 2019 (102-50). This document derives from an evolutionary process, following the annual publishing of a Sustainability Report and a Report and Accounts for 16 consecutive years (102-51, 102-52).

The Integrated Report 2019 reflects LIPOR's adaptation to new trends in financial and non-financial data reporting.

The document presents the Organisation's Strategy, Business Model and approach, its performance and evolution regarding Financial, Manufactured, Natural, Human, Intellectual, and Social and Relationship Capitals. It also presents an analysis of the risks and opportunities associated with the Organisation's activities. Information on Governance, Financial Statements and the Performance of key Sustainability dimensions is also disclosed.

Integrating succinct information, focused on strategy and performance, the Integrated Report 2019 aims to show how the Organisation promotes a sustainable resource management and the creation of shared value.

In this context, the Integrated Report 2019 reinforces our commitment to Transparency and Stakeholder Engagement, being particularly addressed to Stakeholders.

This document has been drawn up according to the guidelines of the International Integrated Reporting Council (IIRC), and, as far as Sustainability is concerned, according to the guidelines issued by the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI), an international standard on sustainability reporting.

The Report has been prepared in accordance with the GRI Standards: Core option (102-54).

Information regarding the GRI contents can be found in the Table on page 157 of this report.

The Financial Statements were drawn up according to the International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), as implemented in the European Union.

According to the best practices and to ensure data reliability and veracity, information regarding sustainability reported in LIPOR's Integrated Report 2019 was properly subjected to independent external assurance by ERNST & YOUNG AUDIT & ASSOCIADOS - SROC S.A. (102-56), having the Board of Directors received the External Assurance Statement and the AA1000APS (2018) Standard Licence, as stated on page 173 of this report.

The "infinity" was the inspiring theme for the design of LIPOR's first Integrated Report. The "infinity" has an open form, as does LIPOR's work, which is constantly evolving, as well as the renewal and recovery of raw materials, and everything surrounding its activities. LIPOR doesn't stop, it is a very dynamic Organisation.

With a clear approach to waste management based on a resource perspective, LIPOR developed a management strategy that favours value creation throughout the entire productive cycle, by promoting a sustainable use of resources and closing the cycle with the reintroduction of waste as a resource in the value chain.

LIPOR's Integrated MW Management Model

LIPOR's Integrated Waste Recovery, Treatment and Confinement Strategy rests on three main areas:

- > Multimaterial Recovery,
- > Organic Recovery,
- > Energy Recovery,

complemented by a Landfill, which exclusively receives waste that has no recovery potential.

The new sectoral trends, associated with the challenges of Industry 4.0, as well as global environmental challenges and social and behavioural changes, pose new challenges on Sustainable Municipal Waste Management, reinforcing its importance, at the same time.







2.2 CORPORATE STRATEGY)



GOVERNANCE

LIPOR was founded as a Municipalities Association in 1982, and its Bodies are the Intermunicipal Assembly and the Board of Directors (102-5).


LIPOR's governance model has proved to be quite fruitful, as it effectively matches the strategy and goals set by the Organisation.

While the Intermunicipal Assembly is LIPOR's deliberative body, the Board of Directors is the executive body. Comprising Directors who represent the Associated Municipalities (Mayors or City Councilmen), the Board of Directors meets regularly (every two weeks) and takes part in the Organisation's decisions, which are usually unanimous (102-23).

LIPOR's Management comprises the following members (102-18); (405-1):










The independence of the members of the Bodies (Intermunicipal Assembly and Board of Directors) is ensured, as it depends on the Local Elections process. In fact, these offices are highly political, as elected Mayors are automatically appointed to LIPOR's Intermunicipal Assembly. The remaining members are appointed by the Municipality from among the elected City Councilmen.

On a proposal from the Board of Directors, the Intermunicipal Assembly appoints the Chief Executive Officer, who is in charge of the professional executive management of the Association. The four heads of the main Organisational Units (with economic, environmental and social competencies) and the Chief

Executive Officer meet weekly for coordination and decision-making purposes, within the duties assigned to them. The Managers of the International Business Unit and the Research, Development and Innovation Unit also report directly to the Chief Executive Officer (102-20).



Furthermore, this governance model fosters a close, transparent relationship with Stakeholders.

BUSINESS

"We want to participate in the Global market and set trends for a Sustainable Future" - this is the vision and main Guideline that serves as a basis for the strategy defined for the 2018-2020 three-year period.

On a financial level, in accordance with the goals set by the Board of Directors, all activities contributed to a Turnover of 50 million euros and an EBITDA of 10 million euros until 2020. The Management Team endeavoured to achieve this result, fully aware of the importance and ambition underlying these goals.

2019 was marked by a close cooperation with our main Service Customers, the associated Municipalities, in the development of projects that resulted in an increase in the amount of recyclable waste collected and a decrease in unsorted waste produced, and projects tailored to the reality of each Municipality.

There was a strong development of Innovation projects, due to a pressing need to increase Turnover, but also to the great complexity and volatility currently faced by the waste management sector in Portugal.

We were also able to maintain high process efficiency and productivity rates, thus increasing the utility of products and materials that are brought to our facilities every day, and directly contributing to a decrease in Costs. LIPOR gave priority to enhancing recovery of the different by-products that result from daily operations, having introduced a new "open market" approach.

The unique nature of LIPOR's Institutional Model is particularly important in a Regulation context. The close interaction between the Management Team and the Regulation Authority ERSAR is crucial to the future development of LIPOR's activities and the stabilisation of its business model.

Since its very beginning, LIPOR adopted an approach to Sustainability as a complementary objective to its core activity, which consists of managing and recovering municipal waste produced in its 8 Associated Municipalities, and as a permanent, integral part of its Business.

In the last biennium, LIPOR took a step further and reinforced its commitment through the creation of the Shared Value SUSTAINABILITY AGENDA.

This transversal Sustainability Agenda, which reflects a comprehensive vision of the Organisation itself, combines LIPOR's material issues, its alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals and the Projects developed by the Organisation.

The main principles of action promote a close relationship with Stakeholders, by appreciating PEOPLE, being in tune with the PLANET, projecting PROSPERITY, and creating value through PARTNERSHIPS.

Current international policies are placing greater importance on the waste issue.

Waste production is a consequence of human activities. According to the Portuguese Environment Agency 2018 Report on the State of the Environment, total municipal waste (MW) production in 2018, in the continental territory, amounted to approx. 4.94 million tons (+ 4.2% in comparison with 2017), corresponding to an annual capitation of 505 kg (/inhab.year), i.e., a daily production of 1.38 kg of MW per inhabitant. These values attest the growth trend in MW production that has subsisted since 2014. This increase is related with economic recovery in Portugal, which seems to show that the goal of dissociating waste production from economic growth is not being achieved.



In view of this situation and of the ambitious goals set by the European Commission, it's urgent to:

- >1 Promote an efficient use of natural resources in economy and dissociate economic growth from the environmental impacts of waste production;
- >2 Boost waste prevention and promote material recycling, aiming to extend its use in economy;
- >3 Enhance preparing for reuse, recycling and recyclable waste quality;
- >4 Reduce municipal waste disposal in landfill;
- >5 Economically enhance and sell recyclable waste and by-products from MW treatment.

At a national level, the revision of PERSU 2020 (Strategic Planfor Municipal Solid Waste 2020) is expected to impose on LIPOR more ambitious goals, hence the importance of implementing innovative waste management solutions, but also of meeting the needs and expectations of our Stakeholders.

This is the context in which LIPOR will present its Strategic Plan 2021-2030, a document that has been working on throughout 2019 and which will set the main activity guidelines for the Organisation.

2.4 RISKS AND OPPORTUNITIES)

Risk awareness and opportunity identification are essential tools at LIPOR's disposal (102-15).



We can't manage what we don't know, so, to have a broad overview of our exposure to risks, we need to be able to anticipate and transform.

The identification, comprehension and integration of the main risks LIPOR faces take place in different moments throughout the year. In this context, the Strategic Meetings held by the Board and the Management Team play an important role, as well as Organisational Units Staff meetings, namely within the scope of LIPOR's Management Systems according to the ISO 9001, ISO 14001 and SA8000 Standards.

Due to their relevance for debating and counselling on specific topics, it is also worth mentioning the Prevention Group, the "Zero Carbon" area and LIPOR's Strategic Plan Group, which comprise Technicians from the different Departments and Organisational Units, who strongly support and enrich the Organisation's Strategy and the determination of Policies and Initiatives.

Each Organisational Unit is responsible for monitoring and ensuring a proactive management, namely through the definition of risk mitigation measures that can reduce risk uncertainty and volatility.

LIPOR's responsible business leadership is characterised by the perception of risks as major opportunities.

In order to manage its progress regarding alignment with Stakeholders' expectations, LIPOR devises a Materiality Matrix every two years (102-21).

This Matrix results from the intersection of the topics deemed relevant by Stakeholders and the topics that the Management team considers to be a priority for LIPOR, based on the strategic guidelines devised for 2018 and 2019 (102-47).



The Materiality management process implemented by LIPOR rests on the AccountAbility Principles (102-46).

The new AA1000AP (2018) Standard aims at providing Organisations a practical set of internationally accepted guidelines that will help them manage, improve and

communicate their accountability and transparency performance regarding the impacts of their policies, decisions, actions, products and services, as well as sustainability. In this sense, in 2019, LIPOR transitioned to the new standard, in order to ensure adequate Stakeholder engagement and management (102-11).

To this purpose, LIPOR has made efforts to include Stakeholders in its decision-making process, clarified the most relevant topics (materiality principle) and developed transparent engagement and communication mechanisms (responsiveness principle), and the natural evolution is to monitor and assess the impact of its activities according to the impact principle of the AA1000AP (2018) Standard (102-43).

In this context, in 2018, LIPOR assembled its material issues and their alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals in its Sustainability Agenda.

"Creating a future where sustainability is integrated in the decision-making process" will continue to be a priority for LIPOR.

This Agenda was monitored for the first time in 2019, being revised every two years (in line with the materiality matrix update) and updated every year (in accordance with the strategic indicators revision).

In 2019, the impacts associated with each material topic were identified, being stated in the following table (102-44):



ENSURE SUSTAINABLE CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION PATTERNS




CIRCULAR ECONOMY

Thinking of the way Societies have developed over time, it's easy to conclude that products result from the transformation of natural resources, being disposed of as waste after use. Based on this model, which is referred to as linear economy model, the greater the purchasing power, the more products are purchased and, consequently, the more waste is produced. If we change this perspective, increasing products lifetime and ensuring a longer material life cycle, we will not only decrease our dependency on natural resources, which, as we all know, are becoming increasingly scarce, but also reduce waste production and create circularity dynamics.

Since 2014, LIPOR has firmly been managing waste as a resource, based on a circular business model that creates shared value. The consolidation of this stance led to the revision of LIPOR's Mission, in 2017, in the light of these concepts.

Among several approaches taken by LIPOR at the beginning of the Value Chain, the core approaches are those that aim at decreasing our dependence on natural resources, replacing them with materials that have already been processed and are considered waste.



In this context, as described in LIPOR's Strategic Plan 2015-2020, our business Universe includes the Multimaterial Recovery, Organic Recovery and Energy Recovery Units, complemented by a Landfill, which exclusively receives waste that has no recovery potential.

INCREASE OF THE AMOUNT OF MATERIALS

In 2019, LIPOR's Operational Units received approx. 545,000 tons of waste, 2% more than in the previous year. The figures reveal an increasing waste production and prove the success of LIPOR's Strategy, reflected by its growing organic and multimaterial recovery capacity, with record figures in 2019.



MW FINAL DISPOSAL (TON)*



These results stem from the efforts made by LIPOR and its Associated Municipalities, both through awareness campaigns and the reinforcement of selective collection (residential and non-residential door-to-door collection), which plays an essential role in the increase of the recyclable

fraction, in detriment of mixed waste collection, ensuring also a higher quality of the collected materials.

2019, revealed that LIPOR continues to evolve positively in terms of the goals set by PERSU 2020, with the achievement of the 3 targets:

- > 1 Recovery from Selective Collection;
- > 2 Preparing for Reuse and Recycling;
- > 3 Diversion of Biodegradable Municipal Waste from Landfill.

RECOVERY FROM SELECTIVE COLLECTION (Kg/inhab.year)




Finally, it's important to highlight LIPOR's position regarding the 10% limit (maximum) of Biodegradable Municipal Waste disposal in Landfill set by the Government for 2020, with substantially lower figures in 2019, thus exemplary fulfilling national and community goals for a good waste management.

It is worth stressing that Multimaterial Recovery plays a fundamental role in the achievement of the goals set for 2015-2020. In cooperation with its Municipalities, LIPOR currently has five projects running:

- > Residential Door-to-Door Selective Collection: Currently under extension, through the implementation of new collection circuits or the reinforcement of existing ones, associated with the campaign "Reciclar é Dar+ (Recycling is Giving More)";
- > Non-residential Door-to-Door Selective Collection: Targeted to Public or Private trade and services entities, by means of projects such "Aqui Separamos com o Coração" (Here We Sort with our Hearts);
- > Customised Environmental Intervention Service (SIAC): Launched in 2019, aiming at a sustained and focused optimisation and management of municipal or similar waste, within Public or Private entities of social, educational or corporate nature. This service also promotes good practices, approaching environmental, behavioural, participative citizenship and social accountability issues;
- > Events: Festivals and musical, sports and cultural events. Here, training and awareness services are offered, as

well as in situ follow up, stands inspection, and waste collection and recovery planning;

> Festivities & Pilgrimages: Promotion of selective collection in local initiatives, such as thematic fairs, pilgrimages and similar events. This project includes customised selective collection systems and communication campaign under the motto "Os seus resíduos podem ser a peça que falta" (Your waste can be the missing piece). The value of the recyclable material collected is allocated to support local Social and Community institutions.

Biowaste (food and green waste) management is one of the main concerns of Municipal Waste Management Systems. On the one hand, because they are a significant fraction of municipal waste produced and, on the other hand, as the decomposition of those disposed of in Landfills causes most methane emissions to the atmosphere.

The treatment and recovery of this waste were the genesis for LIPOR, being reflected in the Composting Plant, which produces a high quality, completely natural compost named NUTRIMAIS®. After receiving the raw materials (food and green waste), sorted at their source, through residential and non-residential selective collection circuits, the Plant carries out the composting process, where all parameters (humidity, oxygen, temperature) are continuously controlled and monitored. In line with the growth trend of the past years, the LIPOR System received 58,791 tons of Biodegradable Municipal Waste, with a 4.1% increase in comparison with 2018 - a new BMW record registered by the System.


The biodegradable waste cycle is closed by supplementary projects that boost waste circularity: through the fight against food waste and the consolidation of food waste prevention, with a growth registered in the "Dose Certa" (Right Serving) and "Embrulha." (Pack it.) projects in 2019; promoting home and community composting practices, which reached 1184 more families in 2019; and also creating food cultivation and gardening areas in cities - "Horta à Porta" (Kitchen Garden at your Door) and "Jardim ao Natural" (Garden in Natural Style) projects - with an additional 7,505 m² of sustainable green area in the reporting year.

LIPOR's main goal is to recover all types of municipal waste (MW). The Energy Recovery Plant, together with disposal in Landfill, closes the integrated waste management cycle. Every day, the Energy Recovery Plant, located in Maia, receives unsorted waste produced in LIPOR's area of intervention and collected through the several circuits of its associated Municipalities, with which it produces electricity and iron scraps.

However, it is necessary and crucial to provide a final destination for waste that couldn't be recovered through multimaterial recycling, organic or energy recovery and also for the by-products that result from the incineration process itself. Technical Confinement in Landfill is the last option within the global waste management system, allowing to close the whole treatment cycle.

Nonetheless, our challenges cannot be limited to selective collection and the extension of Door-to-Door circuits in all our Municipalities, which are, in fact, priorities set in the revision of the National Strategy for Municipal Waste. The **PREVENTION OF WASTE PRODUCTION** will continue to be a crucial point in LIPOR's Strategy. We believe that "the best waste is that which is not produced".

LIPOR's Prevention Plan prioritises Reuse, Recovery and creative transformation as ways to extend product service life.



To fulfil this purpose, we highlight, among other initiatives, the CREW project (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Recovery Centres), developed in cooperation with the European Recycling Platform (ERP), which embodies a new strategy to give a second life to equipment that was going to be disposed of, while engaging the community and enabling them to come up with new solutions for Electrical and Electronic Waste. Therefore, these centres provide training and qualification, while promoting the recovery of Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment.

4 Centres were opened, 225 appliances recovered, and 23 events/awareness actions took place in 2019.

However, as "you can't manage what you can't measure", it is essential to thoroughly monitor selective collection projects. In order to boost the amount of food and recyclable waste received, LIPOR developed an on-line platform, named **DATACENTER**, which is an essential part of this change and a key tool for the collection of detailed information on waste. This Platform allows a real-time follow up of collection circuits and collected amounts, thus improving process management.



The DATACENTER assembles detailed information on waste, from its origin at Citizens' homes or Producers, up to its forwarding to LIPOR's different Industrial Units.

> PRODUCT AND SERVICE QUALITY

In order to **ASSESS THE LEVEL OF SATISFACTION** with the service provided to its customers, LIPOR resorts to an assessment solution tailored to the reality of its Customers, which is conducted by an External Entity. This adapted and tested theoretical model still allows comparison with the results of previous years.

In 2019, the existing questionnaire (assessment instrument) was updated and adapted to the current assessment needs. For the 2019 global assessment, 765 interviews were carried out, 364 of which in the 1st semester and 401 in the 2nd semester. The study universe comprises LIPOR's Customers, divided in categories.

All Customer satisfaction dimensions (Tangible, Reliability, Responsiveness, Assurance and Empathy) received very positive ratings (above 75 points, of a total of 100).

Most Customers would surely recommend LIPOR's products and services and would contact LIPOR again when in need of similar products or services.



The majority of Customers considers LIPOR's work to be better or much better than the year before, highlighting improvements in general customer service and Employee availability, less collection gaps and more information/awareness/dissemination.

In 2006, LIPOR launched NUTRIMAIS for Organic Farming, which is certified by SATIVA for use as a production factor in organic farming. Stemming from the composting process of food and green waste, sorted at its source, NUTRIMAIS is the perfect example of cycle closure within the scope of a Circular Economy.

In 2014, we continued to sell organic and natural products with very low impact in terms of health and safety, either on direct consumers (farmers), or other people in contact with the products (children and/or adults). On the other hand, this product's Life Cycle is natural and, therefore, difficult to change. All parameters which are fundamental to the process are continuously controlled (humidity, oxygen, temperature), thus ensuring the best

results. The entire production is subject to sampling and analysis in accordance with a compost quality verification plan, which includes physical, chemical and biological parameters. Bearing this in mind, improvements in the life cycle are not assessed, namely in production methods aiming at the reduction of its hazardous content, as it is already almost non-existent. (416-1)

With the purpose of ensuring the quality of materials received, LIPOR also develops several projects and initiatives related to the selective collection of Organic Waste and also Green Waste.

Labelling issues are now regulated by Decree-Law no. 103/2015. In the cases of renewal/new marketing authorisation, a label proposal must be included in the process, which will later be validated by the DGAE. In addition to the information conveyed in labels, LIPOR provides its Customers an advisory and recommendation service regarding compost. NUTRIMAIS Compost complies with all requirements defined by the legislation in effect, and its marketing authorisation is valid until 2021 (417-1).



2020 | NEW VERSION OF LIPOR'S STRATEGIC PLAN



> FINANCIAL BALANCE OF THE ORGANISATION

2019 was another challenging year, with very demanding periods for LIPOR and its Employees.


LIPOR registered a positive Net Income of 2,016,268 euros, lower than in 2018, but still showing the Organisation's effort to maintain a Sustainable Business.

Net Income was mainly affected by the decrease in EBITDA (for the reasons mentioned below), a reinforcement in the Provisions item and a reduction in Other Incomes, as in 2018, a considerable amount of adjustments from prior years was included, having contributed to a growth in Net Income that year, which did not take place in 2019.


LIPOR's Turnover grew 1.1%, in comparison with the previous year, based on the positive development of Product Sales and Provision of Services, by 0.4% and 2.1% respectively.

As in the past years, LIPOR stayed focused on increasing the amount of recoverable materials sent for recycling and organic recovery, resulting in a good performance in terms of revenues from compost and recyclable waste sales, which increased by approx. 13% and 4% respectively.

NET INCOME (€)




TURNOVER (€)

LIPOR's consolidated EBITDA reached approx. 6.9 million euros, which corresponds to a margin on Turnover of 17%. In comparison with the previous year, there was a decrease of about 24%.

Turnover growth mitigated the decrease of EBITDA. The evolution of Operating Costs, as a consequence of regular activity growth, particularly costs with Subcontracts, the remaining External Services and Supplies items (Specialised Services, in particular) and Personnel Costs (namely, salary adjustments and updates, in accordance with the State Budget Law - LOE), affected the EBITDA decrease in a decisive way, when compared to the previous year.

In order to continuously improve the performance of its activities, LIPOR seeks to obtain national and community grants to finance its investments. It has embraced the challenge of a sustainable management of municipal waste produced in Greater Porto and set the main guidelines for its activities until 2020.

In order to fulfil its goals, it is fundamental to follow the guidelines of the Structural Programmes and make the utmost use of existing funding opportunities.

Of the different Funding Programmes available, we highlight those that provide the best and most adequate opportunities to the waste sector: Portugal 2020, more specifically, PO SEUR (Operational Programme for Sustainability and Efficient Use of Resources), and the Horizon 2020, LIFE and INTERREG programmes, regarding demonstration and innovation projects.

Until the end of 2019, 88 Applications were submitted to different Structural Funding Programmes, 23 of which obtained assent, with an approval rate of 26%. To be noted that 15 applications are still waiting for an approval decision.

This year, there was an investment of about 7.5 million euros, where 19% of revenues came from National Funds and 4% from European Funds.

At the same time, with projections pointing to a significant growth in the amount of waste in the next years, LIPOR will make important investments for the implementation and extension of Door-to-Door selective collection, as well as the construction of new MW recovery infrastructures and the rehabilitation of the existing ones, with an adjustment to new technologies, in order to ensure the efficiency and effectiveness of the entire System.

Without this investment, we wouldn't be able to deal with the increase in collected and recovered materials, in line with the objectives and goals set in PERSU 2020+, given the current insufficient capacities of the existing infrastructures (sorting and composting processes).



SUPPLIERS

Being a public entity and also following the implementation of the SA8000 Standard, LIPOR develops several actions in order to ensure that its Suppliers comply with labour legislation in effect.

In 2019, LIPOR traded with 731 Suppliers (102-9):

A computer-based warning system of the expenditure application alerts the Employees of the Supply and Accounting Division whenever a Supplier that didn't sign a Statement of Commitment reaches sales volumes of €10,000.00 or higher, or a billing volume of 5 (five) invoices or more.

After reading the Conduct Code, the Supplier must send to the Supply and Accounting Division a duly signed and stamped Statement of Commitment to the Code.

The Conduct Code can be disseminated or sent by means of:

- > E-mail;
- > Specifications (in case of Public Tenders, Direct Procurement and Prior Consultations):
- > Visit to LIPOR's website.

Suppliers are urged by telephone or e-mail to send the Statement of Commitment.

The Statement of Commitment's duration corresponds to a certification cycle (3 years). Once that period expires, all of LIPOR's Suppliers go back to stage O (zero) and the Action Plan's premises/requirements are once again activated.

Having analysed mailing and reception of Statements of Commitment to the Conduct Code in 2019, there

was a decrease in comparison with 2018, as 2019 is the second year of the three-year period, meaning that there isn't the same flow as in the first year of a certification period. In conclusion, 731 Suppliers traded with LIPOR, of which 303 fulfilled the Standard requirements. Of these, 100 Suppliers met both requirements (sales volumes of €10,000 or higher and 5 accounting documents or more), 71 only registered sales amounting to €10,000.00 or more and 132 only registered a billing volume of 5 (five) accounting documents or more.

In this context, it should be reported that (414-1):

- In 2019, 49 Conduct Codes and respective Statements of Commitment were sent.
- > 62 duly signed and stamped Statements of Commitment were received, including the 49 that were sent (100%), while the remaining pertain to Public Procurement Procedures over €5,000.

> CLIMATE CHANGE

An analysis of 181 countries concluded that Portugal is the 19th country where extreme climate events have more impact, according to the "Global Climate Risk Index 2020" report conducted by the environmental think thank Germanwatch. This is attested by the several climatic events that have been afflicting Portugal in the past years. 2019 was a critical year, with July being the hottest month ever registered and a global temperature increase of almost 1 °C.

Being aware of the impacts of these events on its activities and business, LIPOR voluntarily integrated the fight against climate change in its Strategy. Since 2010, with the "3M Strategy - less Waste, less Carbon, more Climate", and more recently the "4M Strategy - less Waste, less Carbon, more Climate, more Biodiversity", LIPOR reinforces its action regarding Adaptation by integrating Biodiversity as one of the pillars for Carbon Neutrality.

In this context, in 2017, LIPOR approved its Adaptation Plan, which comprises 25 prioritised measures that will allow LIPOR and its Stakeholders to increase their resilience to Climate Change. Simultaneously, training and awareness actions have and will continue to take place, as well as engagement and awareness initiatives targeted to main Stakeholders.

Bearing in mind the development of Municipal strategies, during 2019, LIPOR began to revise the measures of its Adaptation Plan, aiming to create synergies to boost the implementation of some of the Plan's measures. Also, in 2019, several applications to structural funds were submitted, to obtain funding for some measures, which will strongly impact the society. In 2020, these measures will be integrated in LIPOR's sites (201-2).



During 2019, 318,264 tCO2e were accounted for, representing a GHG emissions reduction of 1.6%, as compared to 2018. In comparison with 2006 (reference year for the 3M Strategy targets), there was a 21% decrease in emissions (-84,543 tCO2e). This reduction surpasses the goal defined for 2020 (-20%) (305-5).

Bearing in mind LIPOR's direct emissions (scope 1 and 2) that resulted from waste received at LIPOR's facilities and originating from the 8 Associated Municipalities, LIPOR registers an emissions intensity of 0.607 tCO $_2$ /t (305-4).

ENERGY EFFICIENCY

The maturity of the Energy Management System and the available resources ensure the System's capacity to fulfil relevant requirements and continuously monitor the facilities' consumptions.

The final report of the Rationalisation Agreement for Energy Consumption (ARCE), signed between LIPOR and the Directorate-General for Energy and Geology (DGEG) in 2011, was devised in 2019. Although LIPOR's energy consumption of 374 toe is below the limit set in Decree-Law no. 71/2008 of 15 April 2008 (500 toe), LIPOR decided to voluntarily commission a new Energy Audit, which will be concluded in 2020, as will the transition to the new Standard.


LIPOR's energy performance in 2019 was atypical, compared to that foreseen, with fluctuations throughout

the year. Nonetheless, in comparison with the previous years of 2018 and 2017, LIPOR's performance increased by 9% and 21% respectively. Energy consumption grew by 1.87%, in comparison with 2018, but production also increased by 13.08%. As the main indicator associates production with energy consumption, LIPOR had a more efficient performance, as it produced more with the same amount of energy.

Over the past 9 years, LIPOR has implemented several strategic and procedural actions, aiming to improve the efficiency of its production processes and the Organisation's energy performance. Through the implementation of these actions, LIPOR registered energy savings of about €113,000, until the end of 2019 (302-4).

DIRECT ENERGY CONSUMPTION BY PRIMARY ENERGY SOURCE (IN GJ) (302-1)







> BIODIVERSITY

In 2019, LIPOR developed a communication strategy with the implementation of key messages regarding its biodiversity strategy, divided by different audiences (schools, community in general and technical experts) and based on the following principles:



LIPOR develops a Biodiversity Strategy LIPOR informs Citizens and raises awareness of the need to protect biodiversity LIPOR promotes natural resources sustainability at a regional, national and global level LIPOR promotes

LIPOR's well-known side takes care of our ENVIRONMENT. Our Mission is "To transform waste into new resources through the implementation of innovative, circular practices, generating and sharing value.".

But there is another side that LIPOR would like you to get to know better: our "B" side - for Biodiversity.

One of LIPOR's goals is to boost Biodiversity; as such, it promotes a series of projects in line with the strategic areas defined in the National Strategy for the Conservation of Nature and Biodiversity 2030 (ENCNB 2030): improving the conservation status of natural heritage, fostering recognition of its worth, and boosting Society's appropriation of natural values and biodiversity.





TINTO RIVER VALORISATION AND RESTITUTION PROJECT

The Tinto River Valorisation and Restitution Project has been much appreciated by the Community. In 2019, 20 visits to the Ecological Trail Interpretive Tour were held, with a total of 431 visitors, who had the chance to visit LIPOR's "Laboratório Rios+" (Rivers+ Laboratory), a native natural space which showcases good intervention practices alongside the Tinto River, using several natural engineering techniques.

River Keeper: Position created by LIPOR, with the tasks of monitoring and ensuring a good ecological state of the bed and the banks of the Tinto River, detecting pollution incidents and reporting them to the Authorities, as well as registering the increase of botanical and animal species.

The River Keeper performed 1,245 inspections, having assessed 3,735 parameters and registered 52 incidents. It is worth highlighting the significant decrease in the number of incidents (from 300 in 2018), as a result of the efforts made by all parties involved to improve river water quality.

SQUARE METRE PROGRAMME

LIPOR's Square Metre Programme, which has been promoting the implementation of native forest areas since 2015, registered a successful application within the scope of Notice no. 9451/2019: Nature and Biodiversity Conservation Programme - Improvement of knowledge and conservation status of the country's natural heritage and biodiversity (known as Environmental Fund).



This operation aimed at adding 10 hectares to the current 12 hectares, amounting to 22 hectares included in the Natura 2000 network, in the Porto Mountains area, as well as contributing to the protection and conservation of species identified in the Habitats and Birds Directives or classified as rare species. In addition, it aims to bring the community and remaining stakeholders closer to biodiversity and natural values.













ENVIRONMENTAL AND LANDSCAPE REHABILITATION OF ADVENTURE PARK

With the purpose of further boosting biodiversity in this area, a **Study for the Environmental and Landscape Rehabilitation of Adventure Park** is being carried out since 2018 by a team of planners of the Research Centre in Biodiversity and Genetic Resources, headed by Professor Paulo Farinha Marques.

The Adventure Park, located in LIPOR's facilities, has an area of approx. 19 hectares and resulted from a prior sealing, rehabilitation and environmental landscape recovery project of a former landfill, now being a recreational, leisure and training open-air area, that promotes respect for the environment and biodiversity.

It offers leisure and sports equipment in the flat areas, activity plans that take place mostly during the high season (May to October), and group visits, with the establishment of partnerships that contribute to a broader activity offer.


Its connection to the Ecological Trail and its proximity to a narrow water line of Tinto River and to the Porto Mountains Park further enhance its ecological relevance.

The Adventure Park & Ecological Trail plays an essential role in promoting biodiversity and boosting society's awareness of natural values.

With this in mind, we intend to conceive a naturalistic park, with multi-stratified scrubs interspersed with clearings, thus creating a volumetric contrast. The new green structures will have to be conciliated with the existing ones, in order to add value to them. The creation of water retention basins is also planned, to store water in a more permanent way, contributing both to the embellishment and enjoyment of the park, and to the promotion of biodiversity, by fostering the visit and settlement of several animal species (304-3).

In addition to Employee performance, employment created by our Business Partners (Citrup, Ferrovial, Hidurbe, Veolia), through the operation and exploitation of the Composting Plant, the Multimaterial Recovery Plant, the Energy Recovery Plant and the Landfill, is essential to the results achieved by LIPOR.

The Organisation's Policy for Human Capital reinforcement gives priority to Talent and qualified Staff retention. In 2019, LIPOR closed the year with a total of 202 Employees working full time (7 daily hours), with a 5.4% increase (in comparison with 2018) in the number of Employees.










EMPLOYEES BY GENDER AND CATEGORY (405-1)

REMUNERATION

Career-based remuneration is defined by specific legislation applicable to all Employees in Public Service (Law no. 35/2014 of 20 June and Implementing Decree no. 14/2008 of 31 July), wherefore LIPOR can't apply different remunerations. Annual salary review for Public Administration Employees, as well as daily subsistence, meal and travel allowances scales are defined by Order

no. 1553-C/2008 of 31 December. At LIPOR, the salary scale is applied in the same way to the definition of basic salary by gender, so there's no discrimination regarding remuneration. In 2019, the national minimum wage amounted to €635.07, as determined by the Decree-Law no. 29/2019. (405-2)

Each Employee is a much-needed piece! This is reflected in the equal treatment of all Employees, who enjoy the same rights and benefits.

Direct Employees work under an indefinite-term Employment Contract, while Supervised Workers have a

fixed-term employment contract, and CEI (Employment-Inclusion Contract) Employees maintain their unemployment allowance and also receive a monthly grant from LIPOR.

COLLECTIVE LABOUR AGREEMENTS

LIPOR and SINTAP (Public Administration and Services Workers Trade Union) concluded a Public Employer Collective Agreement, which was published in the "Diário da República", 2nd series, on 28th January 2016 (pages 3372 to 3377). This Public Employer Collective Agreement covers workers affiliated to the signatory Trade Unions with an employment contract in public service, as well as the remaining workers integrated into LIPOR's career system or performing duties at

LIPOR, unless there is an explicit opposition by a non-union worker or by a trade union that hasn't subscribed to the Agreement, concerning its members. The aforementioned Collective Agreement, which had an initial duration of one year, entered into force the day after its publication in the 2nd series of the "Diário da República", being successively renewed for one-year periods. The Agreement is estimated to cover about 200 (two hundred) workers. (102-41)

CAREER DEVELOPMENT AND TALENT MANAGEMENT

Seeking a balance between its needs and expectations and those of its Employees, the Organisation strongly invests in Employee training and skills improvement and development, striving to promote the professional development of its Employees.

CAREER MANAGEMENT

LIPOR gives its Employees the opportunity to assume new job positions or duties through the mobility scheme. According to Law no. 35/2014 of 20 June, mobility is a tool that can be used for public interest purposes, namely when it serves the economy, effectiveness and efficiency of bodies or services. During 2019, LIPOR used this tool to move 5 workers to upper grades. (404-2)

Being a public law legal person, LIPOR's Career Management complies with the proceedings set by General Labour Law for Public Service - Law no. 35/2014 of 20 June. Employee performance is assessed by use of the Integrated System for Management and Performance Assessment of the Public Administration (SIADAP), in accordance with Law no. 66-B/2007 of 28 December, as applied to Local Administration by the Implementing Decree no. 18/2009 of 4 September. This System is based on two areas: individual or shared objectives and competences. With the changes made in the past years, SIADAP 3 became biannual. LIPOR's Employees are currently under the 2019/2020 assessment cycle. (404-3).

TRAINING

LIPOR's Training Plan includes the following Training areas: Technical, Behavioural, Transversal and Strategic.

During 2019, were given 30 training hours/Employee (on average) and a total of 6,1275 training hours. (404-1).

It is worth highlighting the Training Actions held within the scope of the new General Data Protection Regulation, which involved almost all Organisational Units in 2019 and will continue in 2020.

> ETHICS AND INTEGRITY

Within the scope of the SA8000 Social Accountability Certification, the Ethics Code is systematically disseminated among the Employees through internal training actions.

Regarding internal and external mechanisms for concerns about Ethics, Employees may resort to several reporting channels at their disposal, namely:

- > Intranet
- > Suggestion box
- > Worker Representative

Also as part of this Certification, LIPOR has been implementing several control mechanisms that ensure a high level of trust in the System. It is worth highlighting the quarterly Social Accountability visits, where Employees from all areas are interviewed. The entire Organisation is subject to internal and external third-party Audits twice a year, that include an on-site check of working conditions and anonymous interviews to detect any possible fault that may escape from the Organisation's ordinary control (102-17).

Conduct rules regarding professional ethics, that are part of the Ethics Code, must be complied with by all Employees who work at or provide services to LIPOR, regardless of the legal status of their relationship.



BENEFITS GRANTED TO EMPLOYEES

Within the scope of the Social Accountability Certification, and according to the principle of equality, LIPOR includes Supervised Employees in the Social Accountability visits, giving them the opportunity to express their views on several issues regarding their employment relation, among others. They are also invited to participate in general meetings on the Organisation's Strategy, Objectives and Performance Communication, and care is taken to equalise benefits granted to LIPOR's Employees and Supervised Workers (401-2).

In this context, it's worth mentioning the following **benefits** offered by LIPOR to its Employees:

- > Health: Nursing Appointments, Occupational Medicine, Curative Medicine; Workplace Gymnastics; +SAÚDE (+HEALTH) Programme.
- > Employees: Social Canteen; Uniform Washing; Monthly prize draw in the Internal Journal; Drinks machines, Fruit and Yoghurt; Yoga Classes; Life Insurance; Documents & Co.; Tax Return Filling.
- > For our Children: Baby Basket; Christmas Presents; Holiday Camps.
- > **Protocols:** Discounts and special benefits in several services: Health and Pharmacies, Filling Stations, Education and Training, Optical Stores, among others.



SEMENTE - LIPOR Volunteers Association is an important project included in LIPOR's Social Accountability Policy. In this scope, in 2015, a Social Kitchen was established as an economic aid for Employees, providing low-cost meals and, at the same time, employing some Employee family members that were unemployed. The Social Kitchen currently employs 2 workers under this premise. In 2019, 4,644 meals were served, and, as a further development, take-away and catering services were also offered.

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

Preventing work-related injuries and diseases, by promoting hygiene, safety and health, through a thorough analysis of its activities and deriving risks, and the instruction, training and involvement of its employees, is a fundamental principle of LIPOR's Policy regarding this theme.

In 2019, 5 accidents took place, with a 40.91% decrease of the total number of accidents, in comparison with 2018. There was also a 90.61% decrease in the number of lost days due to workplace accidents, with a 90.74% decrease in the severity rate.


The "Comportamentos Seguros" (Safe Behaviour) Project, launched in 2015, aims to encourage Employees to play an active role in their own Safety, in order to avoid accidents. It led to a decrease in the likelihood of accident occurrence from 14.6% in 2015 to 5.9% in 2019, the latter being the lowest figure registered since 2004.

It should be mentioned that, to minimise these risks, LIPOR has been implementing several Prevention measures.

Occupational Medicine provides support in Prevention and Control, allowing to anticipate and act in some risk cases. Several visits to workplaces were carried out to check the Employees' working conditions and implement eventually identified improvements. Furthermore, during 2019, occupational medicine professionals started compiling a database that will allow them to identify the main existing risk groups and implement actions to minimise them.

Regarding the prevention of occupational diseases, there are also some initiatives destined for Employees, that aim to contribute to minimise them, such as:

- > 15-minute practice of Workplace Gymnastics, in administrative and operational areas, before each shift;
- > Internal Uniform Washing Procedure;
- Occupational Medicine Appointments, where a General Practitioner is available once a week, and occasionally also a Nurse, thus giving access to Curative Medicine. (403-3).

In a time of COVID-19 pandemic, LIPOR firmly committed itself to ensuring the required health conditions and devised a Contingency Plan, which comprises the necessary measures to prevent infection and spread of the virus, thus ensuring the fulfilment of the guidelines and recommendations of the Directorate-General for Health (DGS) and the Portuguese Government.

In this context, several extraordinary, temporary and transitional measures were implemented aiming to minimise risks and ensure the well-being and safety of all employees.

Examples of measures implemented by LIPOR within the scope of its COVID-19 Contingency Plan:



The **RDI Strategy** fits into LIPOR's strategic pillars and Value Creation approach, as it seeks to assume a leading position in view of the challenges faced by the Sector, as well as continuous digital change, and changes in society, lifestyles and consumption habits.

To boost the **creation of value**, the Research, Development and Innovation Unit (UIDI) promotes an Innovation Culture (Innovation Management) across the entire Organisation and implements Projects that generate added value (Innovation).

LIPOR has a certification for Research, Development and Innovation (RDI) according to the NP 4457:2007 Standard, and its Management System is implemented across the entire Organisation, for the purpose of Research, Development and Innovation of sustainable waste management solutions.

In 2019, the value of Innovation Scoring was 600 points, on a maximum scale of 1000 points (L2).

> INNOVATION PROJECTS

Being aware of our responsibility to promote a Circular Economy, in addition to Process Digitalisation, our focus is on the development of 3 key areas: the recovery of slag from the Energy Recovery Plant, the development of new farming products and the enhancement of the purity of polymers, aiming at their reintroduction in production processes.

In this context, the following projects were implemented in 2019, with a short-term realisation of the developed solutions.

- > Recovery of incineration slag
- > Production of farming substrates
- > Installation of sensors in composters
- > Implementation of a rigid plastics recovery line




> INNOVATION MANAGEMENT

Creative thinking, seeing things in different perspectives, redesigning processes, facing new challenges creatively, and changing paradigms in the search for new effective solutions are some of the principles we seek to promote transversely amongst Employees.

In this sense, a plan for the promotion of an **Innovation Culture** was devised, aiming to boost Employee engagement and knowledge in terms of Innovation.

In 2019, 100% of the plan was implemented. It is worth highlighting the "What's New" Seminar held in September, with an active participation of Employees from all areas, being an important engagement and knowledge sharing event that mirrored LIPOR's Innovation Culture.



> Technical visits

With Idea Management, we seek to make the best of the creativity of our Employees.

In 2019, 58 ideas were spontaneously submitted by Employees in the Idea Management Internal Platform, of which 91% were validated as innovation or continuous improvement ideas.

In order to promote open innovation and make use of specific competencies not available internally, two external idea competitions were launched, namely:

- Maia Landfill Landscaping Competition, for the conception of an alternative cover solution for a cell of the Landfill of Maia, in partnership with the Faculty of Sciences of the University of Porto
- Conception and design of an object made of incineration slag from the CVE, in partnership with the Design Studio of the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Porto

Knowledge retention is essential for Innovation. Therefore, the Organisation encourages experience and knowledge sharing through the following initiatives:

- > Participation in events, such as congresses and seminars
- > Use of collaboration tools, like Sharepoint or Yammer
- > Promotion of "Innovation Talks", an initiative that fosters idea sharing amongst Employees from different areas.

As a reflection of the knowledge produced by the Organisation, in 2019, 16 technical articles were published, as a result of studies led by LIPOR, some of which in partnership with External Entities.

Through Innovation, we aim at directing the current business model towards the development of new sustainable products with added value. This huge challenge requires focus on research and development, in order to develop new products that are valued by the market, while creating value across all aspects of sustainability.

> INTERNATIONALISATION

Through the strategic pillar of Internationalisation, LIPOR seeks to drive new businesses and to project the Organisation and its Brand.

Based on know-how, knowledge and experience from 37 years at the service of the Community, Municipalities and remaining Stakeholders, LIPOR's International Business Unit (UNI) offers a specialised technical consulting service in an international context, with solutions tailored to the particularities of each Customer.

In 2019, LIPOR established business and prospection relationships with 26 Countries. It registered 13 Expressions of Interest, developed 2 Preliminary Studies, and presented 4 Proposals, of which 2 were approved. (L5)

The Expressions of Interest submitted in 2019 are distributed over the following geographical areas: 5 pertain to Latin America, 4 to Africa, 3 to Asia and 1 to Europe.

As for the Proposals, 2 pertain to Africa, 1 to Asia and 1 to Europe.

The Preliminary Studies were targeted at Brazil and Mozambique.

The Competencies Pool comprises LIPOR's International Consultants and Technicians, who are prepared to integrate International Project teams. It consists of 29 Senior Technicians from LIPOR's several organisational units, with different levels of expertise and training.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS

Business Mission to Tunisia

Following the contacts initiated during the Official Visit of the Portuguese Minister of the Environment to Tunisia, in January 2018, this Business Mission took place to promote the Portuguese waste management sector and explore business opportunities.

11 Portuguese entities participated in the Mission,



including LIPOR and representatives from the Ministry of the Environment and Energy Transition. In this context, LIPOR was appointed as the implementing entity of an Environmental Education Project destined to Tunisia, funded by the Portuguese Environmental Cooperation Fund.

Mission in Washington - Multilateral Development Bank

LIPOR visited the World Bank (WB) and the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), in Washington. The Chairman of the Board of Directors, the CEO and the Head of the UNI Unit participated in this Mission, which gave rise to several subsequent initiatives. Namely, LIPOR's participation in the IDB annual retreat, as a

reference and example of Good Practices, following an invitation from senior representatives of the IDB Water and Sanitation Division, and a visit from the Head of this division to LIPOR, to know more about its facilities and competencies.

Town Twinning Programme - Samsun Region (Turkey)

LIPOR participated in the Partnership for Sustainable Future project, an initiative included in the Town Twinning Action between Turkey and the EU Grant Scheme (TTGS), as a reference for the integration of the Sustainable Development Goals and circularity practices. LIPOR shared good practices and projects, knowledge and

experience through technical support and qualification. In this context, two missions took place, one in Turkey, to gain insight on local circumstances and for diagnosis purposes, and another one in Portugal, for a technical visit. In addition, a conference was held in Turkey, in December, to conclude the Project.

Participation in International Work Groups

As far as the approach to international reference entities is concerned, it is worth highlighting the participation in the ECN (European Compost Network) Board and in

several international events, as a guest, to present and demonstrate LIPOR' good practices, as a reference at a national, European and international level.

Visits from International Delegations

Particular mention should be made of the interest that several international delegations have shown in LIPOR. 2019 was no exception, with 20 visits from international

delegations, of 14 different nationalities and with a total of 122 visitors.

> COMMUNICATION

The reinforcement of the LIPOR Brand activation strategy among its internal and external audiences, focusing on Brand positioning and an integrated communication in line with the Organisation, is crucial to achieve results and materialise the concepts and values of the Brand amongst its audiences, bringing it closer to them and allowing them to experience it.

In 2019, LIPOR and its Associated Municipalities changed the way they divulge recycling!

The motto is clear: RECYCLE YOURSELF! CHANGE YOUR ATTITUDE, CHANGE YOUR LIFE, TRANSFORM YOURSELF.

This aims at raising Citizen awareness of the importance of recycling waste and placing it properly in eco-containers and other selective collection systems. Waste recycling practices in Portugal still fall short of what is required, so it is urgent to disseminate clearer messages that will hold each and every Citizen accountable for taking care of the Planet.

Therefore, the new Communication Campaign takes on an approach that places citizens at the centre of the problem and of the solution, questioning them regarding their habits and encouraging them to join the people that already recycle and have overcome this problem.



Some results obtained in 2019:

- > 551% of respondents said that the Campaign is very different from other recycling Campaigns;
- > Willingness to recycle has increased by 10%;
- > 30% of respondents concluded that recycling is everyone's duty and responsibility

> ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING

LIPOR's Environmental Education and Training (EFA) area has been continuously developed since 1996 and is a particularly important strategic guideline for the Organisation, representing the Board's continuous effort to promote an environmental culture amongst the Community. It is based on 3 major lines of action: Adopting Circular Economy, Enhancing the Territory and Training the Community, in line with the National Environmental Education Strategy (ENEA 2020).

To Adopt Circular Economy, it is necessary to adopt a technical educational method to educate and put into practice a behavioural change, supported by the optimisation of environmental management and continuous follow-up processes, which are part of the "LIPOR Geração+" (LIPOR Generation+) Project.

The "LIPOR Generation+" Project has the institutional support of the Directorate-General for Education and the Portuguese Environment Agency, and is also supported by Sociedade Ponto Verde.

Enhancing the Territory aims at promoting and acknowledging the social, cultural and sustainability roles of natural systems and being aware of their worth. The protection of soils, the sustainable management of water resources, the recovery of environmental liabilities, and the promotion of nature and biodiversity are paramount to the establishment of balanced, sustainable territories.

In 2019, it is worth mentioning the exponential growth in the number of visitors to LIPOR's Environmental Education Equipment and the work undertaken by the team to optimise the educational and pedagogical process for and with visitors, thus enriching citizens' experience at LIPOR. It is also important to highlight the efforts of the Green Spaces team to provide close support to "Kitchen Garden at your Door" and "Garden in Natural Style" customers, resulting in the increase of the sustainable farming area monitored by LIPOR, as well as the actions included in the Strategy against Marine Litter, which took on particular relevance in 2019.

The Projects and Initiatives included in the Environmental Education Strategy involved approx. 130,304 Citizens. (L1)

The enhancement of Citizens' Environmental Literacy is a permanent challenge that can only be overcome through a solid strategy for environmental awareness of Heads, Technicians and the Community in general. The purpose

of this line of action is to give access, in a structured way, to training programmes destined for specific audiences, more or less interested, more or less knowledgeable, mainly aiming to Train the Community.

This goal is consolidated by **LIPOR ACADEMY**, which aims to develop and enhance competencies through Citizen training and qualification, using advanced educational methods and equipment.



The Academy's training offer encompasses different knowledge areas, including training courses or actions especially devised to meet the market's needs.

LIPOR Academy training is certified by DGERT (Directorate-General for Employment and Labour Relations) and the CEFA Foundation (Foundation for Studies and Municipal Training). LIPOR is also a promoter organisation with accreditation by the Chamber of Engineers.



> COMMITMENT TO STAKEHOLDERS

Through the implementation of a Social Accountability Policy, LIPOR reinforces its action amongst the Local Communities it is part of. With these actions, LIPOR mostly aims at being an integral part of society and actively participating in its development, promoting a good integration in the surrounding society.

The ADVENTURE PARK & ECOLOGICAL TRAIL is part of LIPOR's policy, strongly contributing to the reinforcement of the LIPOR Brand, as well as to its integration into society. This is evident from the number of people who visited us throughout the 10 opening seasons of Adventure Park: 361,027 people.



The Activities Plan is mostly implemented during the high season of the Adventure Park & Trail (May to October), on every weekend (for the population in general) and on Tuesdays and Thursdays for Organised Groups. In its turn, the Ecological Trail is open every day, from 8 am to 8 pm.

The contribution of several partners, that have cooperated with us every year, is essential to the promotion of several activities on weekends. Several facilities are also available, always free of charge. Group visits, which are a daily activity at LIPOR, are destined for Groups, Schools, Associations, Institutions or Companies and include several Tours, such as the Adventure Park Groups (GPA) Tour and the Ecological Trail Tour (CITE).

O ano de 2019 foi marcado pela variedade, tendo as atividades dinamizadas surtido um efeito muito positivo nos visitantes.

In 2019, 70,633 people visited the Adventure Park and the Ecological Trail, with a 28% growth in comparison with 2018.

Having joined the national bottle caps collection movement, LIPOR receives bottle caps, which are forwarded for recycling and whose sales value is used to donate medical, orthopaedic and similar equipment. Donations from 14 stages have already been delivered. The main indicators are:

- > 804 tons of treated bottle caps;
- > 564 benefiting institutions
- > 1.544 donated devices

Attention should be drawn to "Operação Tampinhas" (Bottle Caps Operation), an annual initiative ongoing since April 2006.

In a continuous engagement effort, LIPOR continues to reinforce Partnerships. In 2019, 16 Initiatives were developed in Partnership with several Entities, regarding the most diverse current issues.

LIPOR joins the Portuguese Environment Agency in the 1st National Air Campaign

Bearing in mind the current problem the world is facing, it is essential that people become aware of the need to change their behaviours, to ensure a good air quality in Portugal. If we continue to do nothing, air quality will only get worse.

LIPOR joins Girl Move Academy

LIPOR was once again part of a unique initiative with Transforming Impact. For the second consecutive year, it welcomed a Girl MOVER with a "Life Internship" tailored to her traits and profile. A Programme was thus devised to enable interaction with diverse areas of our Organisation.

EducÁfrica and LIPOR work together in the África 2Eco Project

This project is to be implemented in partnership with schools in PALOP countries and Portugal, bearing

in mind the need to reduce plastic consumption and raise awareness amongst the general population, and particularly young people, of the need to come up with solutions and new lives for the existing plastic.

LIPOR and Oceanário de Lisboa (Lisbon Oceanarium) cooperate to promote ocean literacy

It's becoming ever more important to develop an integrated strategy against marine litter. Lisbon Oceanarium, an acknowledged entity specialised in this topic, and LIPOR are working together to promote ocean preservation and valorisation.

LIPOR joins Serralves Foundation in the Bioblitz initiative

LIPOR's Associated Municipalities and Serralves Foundation have signed a Cooperation Protocol for the "Bioblitz - Discovering Serralves Park's Nature" event, which mainly aims to educate and raise awareness of environmental topics and biodiversity.

8.1. Characterization of Entity:

8.1.1. Identification (name, tax identification number, address, financial arrangements and other elements of identification):

LIPOR - Intermunicipal Service of Waste Management of Greater Porto - gathering together eight Municipalities: Espinho, Gondomar, Maia, Matosinhos, Porto, Póvoa de Varzim, Valongo and Vila do Conde.

LIPOR is a collective person of public law, that in light of its statutes (Article 2., No. 1) has as immediate object the recycling, recovery, treatment and final use of solid waste delivered by Municipalities members, as well as the management, maintenance and development of infrastructure necessary for this purpose.

LIPOR has its registered office in Morena Street n. No. 805-955, Baguim do Monte, Gondomar and national tax number, 501.394.192.

8.1.2. Legislation (constitution, organization and operation, if applicable):

LIPOR is established as an Association of Municipalities. In recent years several legal regulations focused on the connection of Municipalities in order to maximize synergies and promote economies of scale, within the area which has been transferred to them by law. Associations of Municipalities are nowadays one of the typical cases of so-called public associations - one of the ways to apply the principles of the elimination of bureaucracy in public administration and to offer services to the people, as proclaimed in Article 267, 1, of the Basic Law, according to the revision of 1982.

In fact, there are certain public interests that should be satisfied by the collective person, in this case the Municipalities, but decides not to proceed through its direct administration, handing over its management to another collective public person. Especially when that new person is a kind of collective public associations, gathering efforts and material and human resources of several members to better carry out such specific and common purposes.

Currently, LIPOR, as an Association of Municipalities, is governed by Law No. 75/2013, dated September 12th, which establishes the legal framework for local government, approves the status of Inter-municipal Entities, defines the legal system forthe transfer of powers from the State to Local Authorities and Intermunicipal Entities and approves the legal system of Municipal Associations.

The Legislator sets forth, in Article 63(1) of Law No. 75/2013, dated September 12th, that "Public associations of local authorities may be established for the joint pursuit of the respective responsibilities..." and local authority associations shall include metropolitan areas, intermunicipal communities and associations of municipalities and boroughs for specific purposes.

Under Law no. 75/2013, Associations of Municipalities shall again be governed by the rules applicable to legal persons under public law and shall be subject to the "State's legal system for financial and property administration".

LIPOR is bound to the accounting system applicable to municipalities (POCAL - Official Accounting Plan for Local Government, approved by Decree-Law no. 54-A/99, dated February 22nd).

Being a public organisation, and according to Law and to its By-Laws, LIPOR is subject to local political cycles (local elections).

Therefore, the Associated Municipalities are members of the Association of Municipalities, and are personally represented by members of the respective City Council. Their competences as representatives of the members of the Association of Municipalities are in dissociable from their position as members of the respective City Council, and these competences shall be maintained, suspended or terminated, as their term of office is maintained. suspended or terminated.

8.1.3. Effective Organizational Structure (organization chart and, where applicable, details of advisory and monitoring bodies):

The Association shall have the following organs: Intermunicipal Assembly and Board of Directors.

The Intermunicipal Assembly is the deliberative organ of LIPOR and is composed by the President and two Councilors from each of the associated Municipalities with a total of twenty-four elements. Among its main attributions, we underline the approval of the Budget, Business Plans and Activity Report, Balance Sheet and Accounts of the Association. The Intermunicipal Assembly normally meets twice a year.

The Board of Directors is the executive body, composed by five effective directors and three alternates, representing the associated Municipalities and elected by the Intermunicipal among its members. The Board has regular weekly meetings at the Headquarters of LIPOR. Although existing only five effective elements, eight elements regularly participate in meetings and decisions of the organization, what implies that the Board of Directors consists of eight directors.

As regards the independence of the board members (Intermunicipal Assembly and Board of Directors) this is guaranteed, since it is dependent on a process of scrutiny in local elections. In fact these positions are highly political. The elected mayors are automatically assigned to the Intermunicipal Assembly of LIPOR. In the case there exist other elements, they are designated by the city, between the councilors elected.

The Intermunicipal Assembly on the recommendation of the Board of Directors appoints the **Chief Executive**Officer, who is in charge of the professional executive management of the association, counting with the assistance of the responsible of the different units, which

are part of the management of the organization. The duties of the Chief Executive Officer are provided by Dr. Fernando António Ferreira Leite.

Regarding the selection of the Chief Executive Officer, this was based on his experience in the waste sector and its suitability for the job. Its renewal in this position by successive Boards of Directors have been based on the results, demonstrating his skills for the job.


The Decree no. 18/2009, which entered into force on 1st of October, adapted the Integrated Management and Performance Assessment in Public Administration (SIADAP), approved by Law 66-B/2007, from 28th of December to the Local Government.

Due to the publication and entry into force of this law, the Intermunicipal Assembly, within its powers and through the nomination of the Board of Directors, adopted in a regular meeting held on January 20th, 2010, the Rules of Procedure which embody a new macrostructure organization of the Association.

In September 2016, the Association's decision-making bodies approved a change to the organisational Macrostructure, which was embodied and materialised in a new Internal Regulation. This document was published in the "Diário da República" on 26th September 2016, having the macrostructural change entered into force on 1st October 2016.

Therefore, in the daily management of the organization, in addition to the Chief Executive Officer, the Administration has the monitoring of a set of responsible with advice functions of the several units, increasing the ability of governance.

The new organization chart coresponding to the approved Macrostructure by the bodies of LIPOR, currently in effect, is as follows:



8.1.4. Summary Description of Activities:

The immediate object of the Association is the recovery and treatment of solid waste delivered by the associated Municipalities and other entities which the Association will admit, as well as the management, maintenance and development of the necessary infrastructure for this purpose.

The Association may have its immediate object expanded and pursue any purpose comprised in the duties of the Municipalities members, except those which by their nature or by law must be exercised directly by them.


8.1.6 - Accounting Information Scheme

The development and constant innovation of the Organization requires an agile, versatile and above all reliable feedback circuit. This way, and being included in a development project of the information system, has been made a thorough analysis of the existing applications, the improvements to implement and the new application needs, being this project currently developed by an external provider.

The management application consists of several interconnected modules and developed based on the most recent programming tools of Oracle (Developer6i), supported also by an Oracle database.

In support of the installed applications are available analysis tools, specifically, business intelligence Cognos (IBM) and Discoverer (Oracle).

The following table illustrates the already implemented modules and their interconnection.



8.1.7 - Other relevant information

LIPOR's information system is fully operational, running under a philosophy of continuous improvement, so that we can adapt ourselves to new needs and improve the already existing information.

These procedures aim at an increasing and quicker provision of the information needed for decision-making.

8.2 - Notes to the Balance Sheet and profit and loss account

8.2.3 - Accounting Policies in Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account

The principal accounting policies used in the financial statements preparation were as follows:

Fixed assets

Intangible Fixed Assets

Intangible assets, mainly consisting of expenditures in environmental awareness campaigns and studies and projects expenses not affected to other tangible assets are recorded at cost and are amortized using the straight-line method on a monthly basis in three years.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible assets acquired until December 31st, 1991 are stated at cost of acquisition, revalued in accordance with the provisions contained in Decree-Law No. 399-G/84 of June 2nd, 118-B/86 of 27th of May, 111/88, April 2nd, 49/91 of January 25th and 264/92 dated November 24th.

The assets acquired after that date are recorded at cost of acquisition.

Depreciation is calculated by the straight line method, on a duodecimal basis on acquisition cost on a monthly basis according to the maximum rates set out in Regulatory Decree 2/90, for assets acquired until December 31st, 1999 and Decree 671/2000 of 17th of April for assets acquired after that date according to the following ranges:

Stocks

For the valuation of raw materials, subsidiaries and other consumables was considered the purchase price. The valuation of finished products was based on the selling price.

Provisions for doubtful debts

According to the POCAL, is established a provision of 100% for doubtful accounts for receivables from non-public entities not covered by guarantees, insurance or surety, older than 12 months.

Accrual

LIPOR records its income and expenditure in the financial statements in accordance with the principle of accrual, whereby the revenues and expenses are recognized as they are generated, regardless of when they are received or paid. The differences between the amounts received and paid the corresponding income and expenses are recorded under accruals and deferrals.

Subsidies to finance tangible fixed assets

Non-repayable fund subsidies granted to LIPOR for specific financing of certain tangible fixed assets are stated as deferred income under the item "Accruals and deferrals", and recognized in the financial statements in proportion to the estimated useful lives for subsidized tangible assets.

Transfers Obtained

The annual financial contributions obtained from the Municipalities associated to LIPOR, granted by way of generic reimbursement to investment, as part of its duties and obligations with LIPOR and according to Article 6 no. 1 point d) of the statutes, are in the Profit and Loss Account heading "Transfers and subsidies obtained" and fully recognized as income for the year.

8.2.4 - Exchange rates used for the conversion of transactions, recorded in the accounts included in the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account originally expressed in foreign currency, into Portuguese currency

The transactions originally denominated in foreign currencies are translated into Euros using the exchange rate at the date of receipt of invoice.

8.2.6 - Note to the accounts 43 'Intangible Fixed Assets'

Intangible assets are considered all the values corresponding to the costs resulting from actions taken

for environmental awareness as well as to the costs of studies and projects not affected to other tangible assets.

These amounts are amortized over three years on a straight-line basis.

Gross assets registered a net increase of about 5.23 million euros, which basically resulted from the basic equipment, fixed assets in progress and environmental awareness items.

Regarding the basic equipment item, the purchase of door-to-door selective collection vehicles and vehicle management and control systems, and the provision of containers for selective collection are particularly relevant.

The fixed assets in progress item comprises the inner platform restructuring works and the provision of equipment for transfer stations and drop-off sites.

As for environmental awareness, it pertains to several campaigns developed by LIPOR to reinforce the importance of recycling and, therefore, boost the amount of selectively collected waste.





Both CEI (Employment-Inclusion Contract) Employees and LIPOR's Direct Employees were taken into consideration, as they have the same rights and benefits. CEI Employees have a fixed-term employment contract, for the application's duration. They have a timecard and are integrated in the personnel file, just as Employees. CEI Employees maintain their unemployment allowance, only receiving a grant from LIPOR.

In this indicator we've used, whenever possible, actual consumption data. When this wasn't possible, data regarding acquired materials were used.

When separating consumptions, all awareness and stationery materials were considered as stationery materials, except for paper. So, stationery materials include A4 and A5 notebooks, dead files, envelopes, cardboard folders, legal paper and diverse awareness leaflets. White and recycled paper include A3 and A5 paper and A4 recycled paper.

Regarding material data pertaining to the Composting Plant, these were restructured, as we started to use data declared to SPV.

Introduction

1. We were contracted by the Board of Directors of LIPOR – Serviço Intermunicipalizado de Gestão de Resíduos do Grande Porto (LIPOR), to proceed with the independent review of the sustainability information disclosed in the 2019 Integrated Report, hereinafter the "Integrated Report", relating to the sustainability performance from 1 January to 31 December 2019.

Responsibilities

- 2. The Board of Directors is responsible for preparing the sustainability information disclosed in the "Integrated Report" and to maintain an appropriate internal control system that allows the information presented to be free of material misstatements due to fraud or error.
- 3. It is our responsibility to issue a limited assurance report, professional and independent, based on the procedures performed and described in the "Scope" section below.

Scope

- 4. Our review procedures have been planned and executed in accordance with the International Standard on Assurance Engagements (ISAE 3000, Revised) – "Assurance engagements other than Audits and Reviews of Historical Financial Information", for a limited level of assurance. It was also considered the AA1000 Assurance Standard (AA1000AS 2008 with 2018 Addendum), type 2 engagement, for a moderate level of assurance.
- 5. The procedures performed in a limited assurance engagement, in accordance with ISAE 3000 (revised), vary in timing and nature from, and are less in extent than for, a reasonable assurance engagement. Therefore, the assurance provided by these procedures is lower than the assurance that would have been obtained had a reasonable assurance engagement been performed. Our independent review procedures comprised the following:
 - Conducting interviews with Management, in order to understand how the information system is structured and assess their level of knowledge of the topics addressed in the report;
 - Review of the processes, criteria and systems adopted to collect, consolidate, report and validate the data for the year 2019;
 - Analytical review, on a sample basis, of the data calculated by Management, and verification of quantitative and qualitative information disclosed in the report;
 - Confirmation on how collection, consolidation, validation and report procedures are being implemented in selected operating units;

- Assessment of the level of adherence to the principles of inclusivity, materiality, responsiveness and impact set by AA1000AP (2018) Standard, in the sustainability information disclosure, through the analysis of the contents of the "Integrated Report" and the internal documents of the Entity; and
- Verification of the conformity of the sustainability information included in the "Integrated Report" with the results of our work.
- Regarding sustainability reporting standards of the Global Reporting Initiative GRI Standards, we
 performed a review of the self-evaluation made by Management of the adopted option to apply the GRI
 Standards.

Quality and independence

7. Our firm applies International Standard on Quality Control 1 (ISQC 1), and consequently maintains a global quality control system which includes documented policies and procedures relating to compliance with ethical requirements, professional standards, and the legal and regulatory provisions applicable and we comply with the independence and ethical requirements of the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants (IESBA) Code of Ethics and the Code of Ethics of the Order of Chartered Accountants (OROC).

Conclusion

8. Based on our work, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the systems and procedures for the collection, consolidation, validation and reporting of the sustainability information disclosed in the "Integrated Report" are not operating appropriately and the information disclosed is not free from relevant material misstatements.

Additionally, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the sustainability information disclosed in the "Integrated Report" do not include all the required data and information for the option "In accordance – Core", as defined by the GRI Standards.

Furthermore, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the sustainability information disclosed in the "Integrated Report" was not prepared in compliance with the principles defined in the AA1000AP (2018) Standard, namely:

- Principle of inclusivity: LIPOR is accountable to those who are impacted by or impact the Entity, thus promoting the engagement of its stakeholders in the definition and implementation of its strategic response to sustainability. LIPOR also has several mechanisms for mapping stakeholder groups and obtaining information concerning their expectations.
- Principle of materiality: LIPOR periodically reviews (biennial cycle) the materiality of the sustainability topics, as to support its management strategy and communication. For this purpose, the Entity uses objective criteria and established processes. In 2018, LIPOR performed a stakeholder engagement process, in order to assess relevant sustainability topics for its stakeholders. LIPOR updated its materiality matrix in 2018, by matching the outcome of the stakeholder engagement process with its strategic guidelines for 2018 and 2019. This materiality matrix remains unchanged in the current fiscal year.
- Principle of responsiveness: LIPOR seeks to address the expectations and concerns of its stakeholders and has adequate mechanisms to fulfill this purpose. LIPOR updated in 2019 the mechanisms and processes for stakeholder engagement and communication.
- Principle of impact: LIPOR monitors and reports, for each material topic, the main direct and indirect impacts of its activity in the short, medium and long term. LIPOR has defined a set of quantitative and qualitative indicators to monitor the operational, economic, environmental and social impacts over time. LIPOR developed its Shared Value Sustainability Agenda to ensure a greater alignment between its strategic objectives and commitments and the most relevant material topics for its stakeholders.

Recommendations

- Concerning the implementation of the principles set by AA1000AP (2018), we presented our recommendations to the Board of Directors of LIPOR. The most significant recommendations are summarized below:
 - Principle of inclusivity: LIPOR has established mechanisms for stakeholder identification and the management of their needs and expectations. We recommend strengthening the stakeholder engagement approach focusing on those who can be directly impacted by LIPOR activity.
 - Principle of materiality: LIPOR has established processes to identify and assess the material topics included in the "Integrated Report". We recommend continuing to update the materiality analysis by periodically listening key stakeholders and encouraging their involvement in LIPOR's strategic decision and risk management.
 - Principle of Responsiveness: LIPOR has efficient mechanisms to communicate with its stakeholders. We recommend that any communication mechanisms development between LIPOR and its stakeholders keep on being reported and reviewed in accordance with its stakeholder engagement strategy.
 - Principle of impact: LIPOR monitoring of its Shared Value Sustainability Agenda started in 2019. This agenda will be annually updated and reviewed every two years, in accordance with its stakeholder engagement processes and materiality reassessments. We recommend for LIPOR's performance towards its targets and commitments to be disclosed in following reporting cycles.

>5.8 GLOSSARY

For the purpose of this Framework, unless stated otherwise, the following terms have the meanings attributed below:

- 1. Business model: The Organisation's system of transforming inputs, through its business activities, into outputs and outcomes, that aims to fulfil the Organisation's strategic purposes and create value over the short, medium and long term.
- 2. Capitals: Stocks of value on which all organisations depend for their success as inputs to their business model, and which are increased, decreased or transformed through the Organisation's business activities and outputs.

They are categorised in this Framework as financial, manufactured, human, social and relationship, and natural capital.

- **3. Content Elements:** The categories of information required to be included in an integrated report. The Content Elements, which are fundamentally linked to each other and are not mutually exclusive, are stated in the form of questions to be answered in a way that makes the relationships between them apparent.
- **4. Guiding Principles:** The principles that underpin the preparation and presentation of an integrated report, informing the content of the report and how information is presented.
- **5. Inputs:** The capitals (resources and relationships) that the Organisation draws upon for its business activities.
- **6. Integrated reporting:** A process founded on integrated thinking that results in a periodic integrated report by an Organisation about value creation over time and related communications regarding aspects of value creation.
- 7. Integrated report: A concise communication about how an Organisation's strategy, governance, performance and prospects, in the context of its external environment, lead to the creation of value in the short, medium and long term.

- **8.** Integrated thinking: The active consideration by an Organisation of the relationships between its various operating and functional units and the capitals that the Organisation uses or affects. Integrated thinking leads to integrated decision-making and actions that consider the creation of value over the short, medium and long term.
- **9.** Material/materiality: A matter is material if it could substantively affect the Organisation's ability to create value in the short, medium or long term.
- **10. Outcomes:** The internal and external consequences (positive and negative) for the capitals as a result of an Organisation's business activities and outputs.
- 11. Outputs: An Organisation's products and services, and any by-products and waste.
- **12. Performance:** An Organisation's achievements relative to its strategic objectives, and its outcomes in terms of its effects on the capitals.
- 13. Providers of Financial Capital: Equity and debt holders and others who provide financial capital, both existing and potential, including lenders and other creditors. This includes the ultimate beneficiaries of investments, collective asset owners, and asset or fund managers.
- **14. Reporting boundary:** The boundary within which matters are considered relevant for inclusion in an Organisation's integrated report.
- 15. Stakeholders: Those groups or individuals that can reasonably be expected to be significantly affected by an Organisation's business activities, outputs or outcomes, or whose actions can reasonably be expected to significantly affect the ability of the Organisation to create value over time. Stakeholders may include Employees, Customers, Suppliers, Business Partners, local Communities, NGOs, Environmental Groups, Legislators, Regulators, and Policymakers.
- **16. Strategy:** Strategic objectives together with the strategies to achieve them.

SLOSSARY

- 17. Those charged with governance: The Person(s) or Organisation(s) with responsibility for overseeing the strategic direction of an Organisation and its obligations with respect to accountability and stewardship.
- **18. Value creation:** The process that results in increases, decreases or transformations of the capitals caused by the Organisation's business activities and outputs.
- 19. Municipal waste: According to the Portuguese General Waste Scheme, Municipal Waste (MW) is "household waste and waste similar in nature and composition to household waste".
- **20.** Biowaste: Biodegradable waste from green spaces, namely gardens, parks, sports fields, as well as biodegradable food and kitchen waste from households, caterers and retail premises, and comparable waste from food processing plants.

- **21.** Biodegradable waste: Any waste that is capable of undergoing anaerobic or aerobic decomposition, such as food and garden waste, and paper and cardboard.
- **22.** Food waste: Any foodstuff or food (substance or product, whether processed, partially processed or unprocessed), intended to be, or reasonably expected to be ingested by humans and which has become waste.
- **23.** Collection: The gathering of waste, including preliminary sorting and storage, for the purposes of transport to a waste treatment facility.
- **24. Selective collection:** Collection where a waste stream is kept selectively by type and nature so as to facilitate a specific treatment.
